- 4) Read the newspaper daily- Find new and difficult words from the paper: make a handmade dictionary, include the new words and their meanings and add a

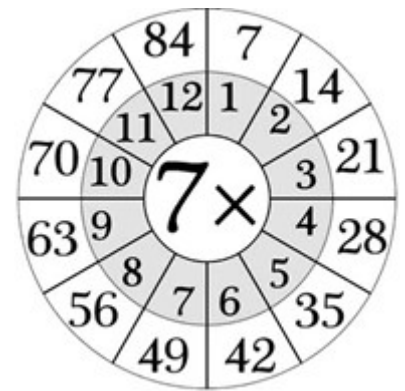
sentence of your own.

Activity 1: Be A Botanist....

A herbarium is a collection of dried plants that botanists use for studying, identifying, and classifying plants. Making an herbarium is a great way for kids and their parents to learn about botany and the plants used in different ways. A herbarium will help you and your child get to know what plants look like, along with improving identification and wild crafting skills. Enjoy exploring nature and working on this herbarium project together! Create an herbarium, which is a kind of plant library. (The herbarium library is composed of sheets of paper holding a plant that has been dried and glued onto the paper.) Each plant is labelled so that you can study that plant at any time. In this activity you are going to press and dry a flower and then make your own herbarium sheet



Instructions For Pressing Plants

- Collect the plants you wish to press and bring them home
- Clean off any dirt or bugs from the plant.
- Open a thick, heavy book and line the pages with a couple pieces of paper
- Place the plant you wish to press on the paper, being careful to spread out the plant so you can see all the parts of it. The entire plant should fit on one piece of paper. If the plant is large, bend and fold it to make it fit. Then carefully close the book
- You can dry several plants in the same book by spacing them several pages apart

· Once you have all the plants you wish to press in you book, put something heavy on top of the book (such as couple more books) and set it aside for 7 to 10 days to let the plants di

Once the plants are dry, you are ready to compile your herbarium pages. Each plant species shou have its own page. Using rarrow pieces of tape, secure each plant onto heavy sheets of paper. Add th previously-recorded information to paper. Finish up each herbarium sheet by placing it in a protectiv plastic cover. Here is some of the information you may want to recor

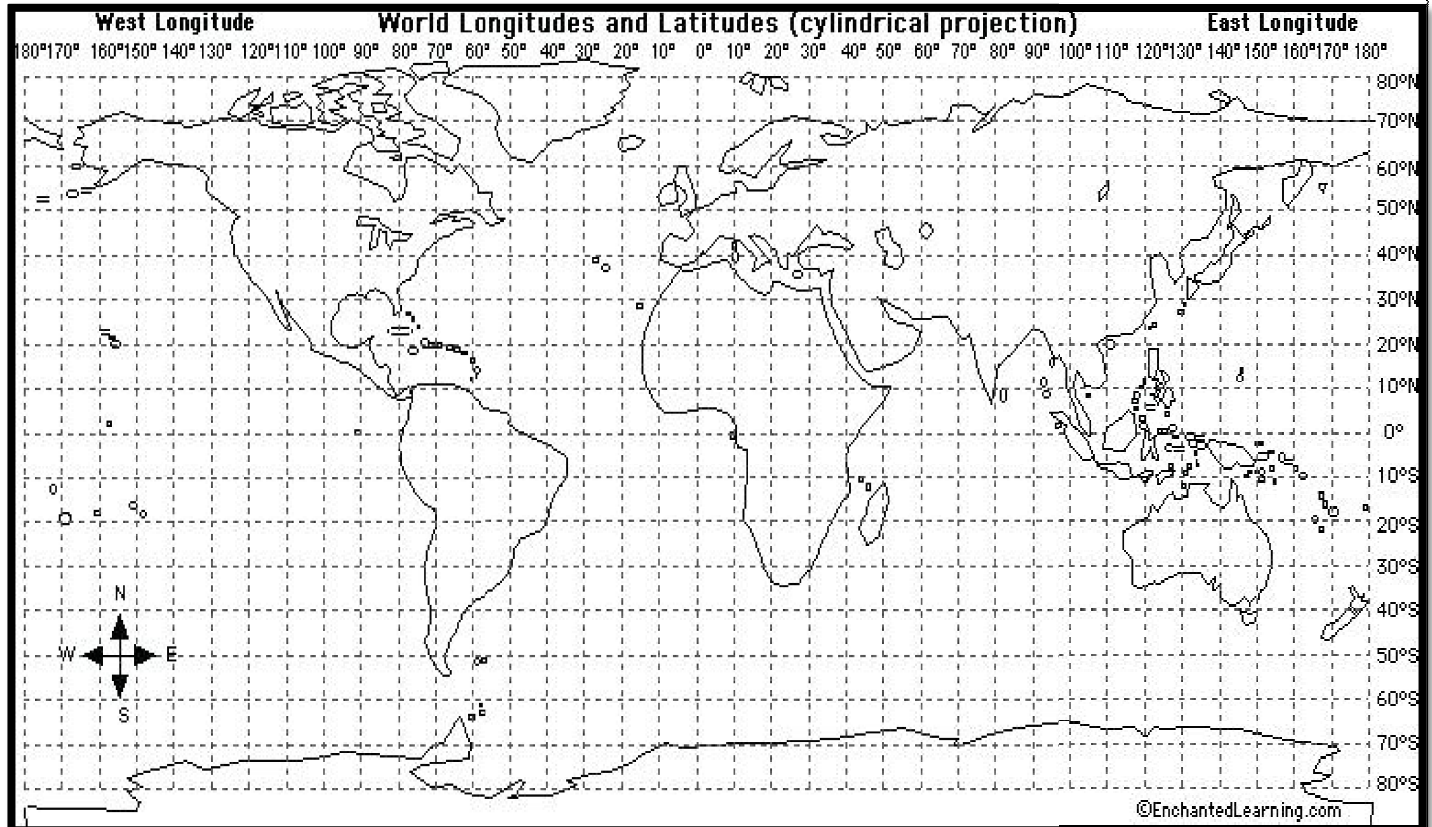
- Common name of the plant
- Scientific name of the plant
- Family name
- Location where you found the plant, including a description of the habitat.
- Does the plant have any medicinal or nutritional qualities?
