

LIS ACADEMIC PHILOSOPHY

Curriculum

The academic program at the LIS is designed to meet the needs of young children. Childhood is a period of rapid growth as children seek out the stimuli, they need to nourish their developing mental abilities. Young children need a sound base of experiences that will be essential for later learning, a strong sense of self-esteem and excitement & curiosity for learning. It is during this time that children develop higher order thinking skills such as problem solving, critical thinking, creative thinking, societal thinking, reflecting thinking etc. Our curriculum is planned and developed to create such experiences for your child.

Pedagogy

Inquiry, as the leading pedagogical approach in the classroom, is recognized as allowing students to be actively involved in their own learning and to take responsibility for that learning. Inquiry allows each student's understanding of the world to develop in a manner and at a rate that is unique to that student. It is recognized that there is a role for drill and practise in the classroom. Yet it is felt that teaching to the fullest extent possible about topics that are concept based, leads to the most substantial and enduring learning.

Assessment

Teachers at LIS use a variety of assessment tools and techniques to build a detailed understanding of each learner's development. Teachers assess students before, during and at the culmination of units of study, as well as at intervals throughout the year. Assessment data supports teachers in designing learning experiences according to the needs of their students. Specialists in the field of individual needs also track student progress and share their understanding with classroom teachers and parents.

Scholastic and Co-Scholastic Activities

Education at all levels is also viewed today as acquisition of skills rather than bookish knowledge. As such, the curriculum imposes the imperative need

of including in it a variety of activities that impart skills that can form the basis for a career later on. It is with this purpose in mind that activities such as art and craft, photography, music, dance and drama, gymnastics, yoga and mass display of fitness and the learning of computers etc, are included in our curriculum. Children are encouraged to be original, creative, analytical and expressive.

Laboratories and Library

The school is equipped with modern science laboratories and activity labs. The LIS library is an information-rich, technology-dense learning center where students, faculty and staff come for research, quiet study and leisure reading. Its mission is to help students become effective, ethical users of information for academic & life success and for personal enrichment.

Library resources are carefully selected to represent a variety of viewpoints on contemporary and historical issues, enhance and enrich all areas of the academic curriculum, and allow students to explore classroom subjects of personal interest more fully. The collection includes books, journals, newspapers, DVDs, videos and CDs. Online resources include carefully planned access to internet, e-resources & e-texts.

Information & Communication Technology

Technology at LIS exists as a tool to help, enrich and aid in the work we do each day. The use of Technology at school should be efficient, transparent and add significant value in meeting the set goals.

All class rooms are well equipped with networked interactive smart boards. The classrooms are networked and connected to a learning resource centre, which is a treasure house of information in the field of education as far as subject content is concerned. The school has wifi. There is one resource lab for computer learning, computer networked work rooms, networked class rooms with smart boards and LCD labs to facilitate the teaching learning process.





THE LAKSHYAN ATTITUDES

At Lakshya, students should demonstrate:

Creativity: Being creative and imaginative in their thinking and in their approach to problems and dilemmas.

Curiosity: Being curious about the nature of learning, about the world, its people and cultures.

Empathy: Imagining themselves in another's situation in order to understand his or her reasoning and emotions, so as to be open-minded and reflective about the perspectives of others.

Enthusiasm: Enjoying learning and willingly putting the effort into the process.

Independence: Thinking and acting independently, making their own judgments based on reasoned argument, and being able to defend their judgments.

Integrity: Being honest and demonstrating a considered sense of fairness.

Respect: Respecting themselves, others and the world around them.

Tolerance: Being sensitive about differences and diversity in the world and being responsive to the needs of others.



ASSESSMENT FOR STUDENTS (IK TO V)

Through the present assessment systems, it hepls to identify what students know, understand, can do and value at different stages in the teaching and learning process.

Learning is viewed as a continuous journey, where teachers identify students' needs and use assessment data to plan the next stage of their learning.

Teachers use a wide range of assessment strategies to collect information on each of the elements represented in the written curriculum: the understanding of concepts, the acquisition of knowledge, the mastering of skills, the development of positive attitudes and the ability to take responsible action.

- 8. Assessment should enable and motivate students to show what they can do
- 9. Assessment should combine information of different kinds, including students' self assessments, to inform decisions about students' learning and achievements
- 10. Assessment methods should meet standards that reflect a broad consensus on quality at all levels from classroom practice to national policy

PRINCIPLES OF ASSESSMENT PRACTICE

- 1. Assessment of any kind should ultimately improve learning.
- 2. Assessment methods should enable progress in all important learning goals to be facilitated and reported
- 3. Assessment procedures should include explicit processes to ensure that information is valid and is reliable as necessary for its purpose
- 4. Assessment should promote public understanding of learning goals relevant to students' current and future lives
- 5. Assessment of learning outcomes should be treated as approximations, subject to unavoidable errors
- 6. Assessment should be part of a process of teaching that enables students to understand the aims of their learning and how the quality of their achievement will be judged
- 7. Assessment methods should promote the active engagement of students in their learning and its assessment

ASSESSMENT IN DETAILS

- 1. Assessment at the school aligns with the requirements of the Programme(s).
- a. Assessment at the school is integral with planning, teaching and learning.
- b. Assessment addresses all the essential elements of the programme.
- c. The school provides evidence of student learning over time across the curriculum.
- 2. The school communicates its assessment philosophy, policy and procedures to the school community.
- 3. The school uses a range of strategies and tools to assess student learning.
- 4. The school provides students with feedback to inform and improve their learning.
- 5. The school has systems for recording student progress aligned with the assessment philosophy of the programme(s).
- 6. Students learning and development related to all attributes of the IB learner profile are assessed and reported.
- 7. The school analyses assessment data to inform teaching and learning.
- 8. The school ensures that students' knowledge and understanding are assessed prior to new learning.

Formative Assessment

Summative Assessment

- Feedback to the students that provides advice on how to improve or move forward, and avoids making comparisons with other students.
- Students understanding the goals of their work and having a grasp of what is good quality work.
- Students being involved in self-assessment so that they take part in identifying what they need to do to improve or move forward.
- Students engaged in expressing and communicating their understandings and skills, initiated by teacher's open and person-centred questions.
- Dialogue between teacher and students that encourages reflection on their learning.
- Teachers using information about ongoing learning to adjust teaching so that all students have opportunity to learn.

- Relates to achievement of broad goals expressed in general terms rather than the goals of particular learning activities.
- Result reported at certain times, not as an everyday part of learning.
- Uses evidence obtained when students are involved in special tasks or tests as part of, or in addition to, regular work.
- 'May be based on teachers' judgements, tests or a combination of these.
- Involves judging the achievement of all students against the same criteria or mark scheme.
- · Requires some measures to assure reliability.
- Typically provides limited, if any, opportunities for student self-assessment.

A. INTERNATIONAL PRIMARY CURRICULUM

Lakshya conducts the International Primary Curriculum for children aged 5 - 11 years old. It is a comprehensive, thematic, creative curriculum, with a clear process of learning and specific learning goals for every subject. It also develops international mindedness and encourages personal learning.

Why Choose the Lakshya Primary Wing (LPW) Programme?

The LPW Programme is flexible and can be adapted to children's interests and level of understanding. It can be integrated with other curriculum to ensure you're meeting statutory requirements, in a creative

and engaging way. At Lakshya, facilitators as well as students are connected to International community of schools, teachers and learners with access to an online space for information sharing. The International School Award Programme in collaboration with British Council, India greatly helps in making. It helps engage parents with learning, and to understand the relevance of learning in the classroom and at home.

Assessment is done by teachers and children to help engage them with learning, and understand their level of skills and knowledge. It encourages collaboration and reflection not just between teachers and pupils, but amongst teachers within the school and worldwide.

Importantly the Lakshya Primary Curriculum has a strong element of Internationalism built into each unit of work. Through the curriculum at Lakshya we provide opportunities for our children to:

- a. recognise their own culture and have a sense of identity.
- b. be open-minded.
- c. be respectful of other cultures and beliefs
- d. be aware of and celebrate diversity and commonality
- e. have respect for and value other people, their ideas and opinions

I) PERIODIC TEST (10 MARKS)

The school should conduct three periodic written tests in the entire academic year and the average of the best two will be taken. The schools have the autonomy to make its own schedule. However,for the purpose of gradient learning, three tests may be held as one being the mid-term test and other the two being pre mid and post mid-term with portion of syllabus cumulatively covered. The gradually increasing portion of contents would prepare students acquire confidence for appearing in the Board examination with 100% syllabus. The school will take the average of the best two tests for final marks submission.

II) NOTEBOOK SUBMISSION (5 MARKS)

Notebook submission as a part of internal assessment is aimed at enhancing seriousness of students towards preparing notes for the topics being taught in the classroom as well as assignments. This also addresses the critical aspect of regularity, punctuality, neatness and notebook upkeep.

III) SUBJECT ENRICHMENT ACTIVITIES (5 MARKS)

These are subject specific application activities aimed at enrichment of the understanding and skill development These activities are to be recorded internally by respective subject teachers.

For Languages: Activities conducted for subject enrichment in languages should aim at equipping the learner to develop effective speaking and listening skills.

For Mathematics: The listed laboratory activities and projects as given in the prescribed publication of CBSE/NCERT may be followed.

For Science: The listed practical works / activities may be carried out as prescribed by the CBSE in the curriculum.

For Social Science: Map and project work may be undertaken as prescribed by the CBSE in the curriculum.

2. Co- Scholastic Activities: Schools should promote co-curricular activities for the holistic development of the student. These activities will be graded on a 5-point grading scale (A to E) and will have no descriptive indicators. No up scaling of grades will be done.

3. Discipline (Attendance, Sincerity, Behaviour, Values)

Discipline significantly impacts career shaping and it helps build character Sincerity, good behavior and values develop strength and foster unity and co-operation. Therefore, the element of discipline has been introduced. Class teacher will be responsible for grading the students on a Five-point scale (A to E).

The internal assessment comprising 20 marks (10+5+5) entails objectivity and a structured approach. For a holistic assessment, the teachers are expected to make it an effective tool.

B. DOCUMENTATION:

Records pertaining to the internal assessment of the students done by the schools will be maintained for a period of three months from the date of declaration of result for verification at the discretion of the Board. Subjudiced cases, if any or those involving RTI/ Grievances may however be retained beyond three months.

C. ASSESSMENT SCHEME FOR CLASS-VI TO IX IN THE CBSE AFFILIATED SCHOOLS:

We at Lakshya, for the purpose of uniformity in classes VI to IX will, replicate the same assessment model as described above for Class-X for Academic Year 2019-20.

The community service initiatives in the school involves doing awareness campaigns, visits to old age homes, orphanages, deaf & mute centres, eco-sanitation drives. Students and faculty at LIS embrace community service with enthusiasm and joy.

Visual & Performing Arts Design

Student Wellness Program (SWP)

Student Wellness & Health Promotion cultivates a healthy and safe community that inspires students to succeed as leaders, role models, advocates and good citizens. The programme is conducted with Meditation sessions with affirmations, Ted talks, Short value based videos with Q & A sessions.

DEAR Program

A weekly DEAR program (Drop Everything And Read) provides students with much more than a just-sit-thereand –read experience. It gives the teacher a structured time to touch base with each student over a period of time, assess progress and target instruction.

Personality Development Workshops

Students at LIS are exposed to various types of Personality Development Workshop that will help that to understand yourself better and shape your thinking and your perception of yourself and others.



CLUBS DESIGN AT LIS

Effective learning does not always take place exclusively in the classroom. As a school we wish to broaden learning horizons so that students can connect the outside world to their work in school. Each club in school tries to provides these enrichment activities. This may involve field work in art and sculpture, dance and drama, music and singing, theatre, yoga, animation and robotics, photography and photo shop, ,design and technology, community and humane society, climate control and eco club etc. Or simply a visit for fun whilst developing social skills and making new friends.

Our showcase events each year includes annual cultural fiesta, beyond academics exhibition and grand sports event.

CLUBS PORTFOLIO OPTIONS

1. FUTURE SCIENTIST CLUB

The club will promote scientific interest & activities on campus.

2. VISUAL ARTS CLUB

The club will encourage students to draw and create their imagination, experiences and knowledge of materials and processes as starting points for creative exploration.

3. SCRIPTWRITING & THEATRE CLUB

The club will put up dance and theatrical performance based on social environmental, health & wellness issues. The club will also encourage writing of creative scripts.

4. MUSIC CLUB

The clubs will promote Indian and Western music and plan performances for the same.

5. ECO SUSTAINABILITY CLUB

The clubs will focus on management of waste (water/paper/electricity etc) using the principle of 3 Rs. Make LIS a 'green' school by promoting awareness and behaviour modification.

6. THE DIGITAL EDITING & PHOTOGRAPHY CLUB

7. CUISINE CLUB

The club students and teachers promote healthy eating habits. The students will have sessions on interesting elements like cooking without fire, salad making, international cuisines etc.

Here the students know about - How to become a good leader, how to lead from the front and also from the back.





SCHOOL DISCIPLINE

Discipline is the law of nature. Without it, nothing works. Instruction of discipline among children is the most significant aspect of education not confined to school alone. Parents too must co-operate with the school in observing these norms.

- 1. Irregular attendance, unjustified or unexplained absence from school, habitual late coming, leaving the school premises without permission, disobedience and any type of unruly and objectionable behaviour are consider to be grave acts if indiscipline on the part of a student which can lead to his/ her rustication from the school.
- 2. Students on their way to and from the School are expected to deport themselves in a responsible manner. Being on the road in any mode of transport entails caution, care and attention to safety rules.
- 3. Students are expected to reach home late after the school due to personal reasons must inform their parents/ quardians in advance
- 4. Students are expected to take proper care of the School property. It is there for their convenience.
- 5. Students should not break any item of furniture and fixtures within the School. Any damage done will be made good by the one who causes it.
- 6. Students should not write, scratch or engrave graffiti on desks, chairs and other surfaces. They should not damage or remove things belonging to other students.
- 7. Damage done even by accident must be reported at once to the Principal. Anyone who notices something damaged must report the matter to any of the personnel mentioned above.
- 8. If the student causing damage to the School property is identified, he/she will be charged along with a fine.
- 9. In the event of collective damage to school property in a classroom, the entire class occupying that classroom will be charged the cost of the damages.
- 10. The School is not to be held responsible for the loss of personal belongings. It is not advisable for students to bring valuables to school.
- 11. Running and shouting in the school premises is not allowed. While using staircases and corridors, all must keep to the left. Loitering in the lobby and the office areas is strictly forbidden even during the recess.
- 12. Students are strictly forbidden from purchasing eatables from unauthorized vendors/hawkers. STUDENT SHOULD NOT BUY ANY EATABLES FROM OUTSIDE WHILE TRAVELLING IN THE SCHOOL BUS. IT IS STRICTLY PROHIBITED.
- 13. No money collection is allowed in the school without prior permission of the Principal.
- 14. At the end of each terminal examination, all students are issued their Report Cards which are to be

- signed by their parents/guardians and then returned to the school within three days of the receipt of the card.
- 15. Bus Monitors and Teacher Escorts are responsible for orderly behaviour in the bus. Any unruly and in disciplined behaviour while travelling in the bus will result in expulsion from the bus facility.
- 16. It is compulsory for all students to attend the assembly.
- 17. All our students should observe high standards in their general get up, department and conduct.
- 18. Use of foul and unparliamentarily language is not acceptable.
- 19. In order to acquire competency in spoken English, all students must converse in English while they are in school, at home and while travelling in the School bus.
- 20. Using unfair means in a test or examination or assessment is a grave offence. A student who is found using unfair means will be awarded zero in the subject and will be issued strict warning. Repetition of the same offence will result in his/her rustication from the school.
- 21. Students are not permitted to carry cellular phones, i-pods,CD's, DVD's,e-games,pen drives etc. They are not allowed to use school phones without permission. They cannot be called to the School office to attend to phone calls during school hours.
- 22. Students are not permitted to carry and use whitener/correction fluid/thinner to school.
- 23. A Student indulging in any act of indiscipline could be given severe punishment, as severe as suspension/rustication from the school.

SCHOOL LIBRARY RULES

- 1. Each member / student will be provided a non transferable borrower's ticket at the beginning of the session which is to be produced before the librarian to get books issued from the library.
- 2. The readers shall not sub-lend the books issued by the library.
- 3. Borrowers must satisfy themselves about the physical condition of the books before borrowing or else they shall be held responsible for any damage or mutilation noticed at the time of returning
- 4. If the book is lost, the reader has to pay the cost of the book or replace the book
- 5. The students must return the book on the given due date.
- 6. Late fine will be charged Rs..10 per day per volume after the due date.

CODE OF CONDUCT

- That the main focus of any discipline measure is of remediation and prevention and focuses on the student's overall development.
- The School, its teachers, personal counselor and the parents partner in ensuring the disciplined growth and development of the child.
- Inculcating of value education to foster the students to develop good moral and responsible social behaviour.

We expect Lakshyans to:

- Wear the prescribed school uniform any modification to the uniform is not allowed.
- Attend all school activities punctually.
- · Be environment friendly.
- Always be ready to help those in need.
- Be respectful and courteous to everyone.
- · Be steadfast in all that they do.
- Take pride in their work.
- Think & be responsible in all their actions.
- Work as a team to bring glory to the school.

Code of Conduct for Student Scholars

All School rules apply to all students from the time they leave home for school until they return home at the end of the school day, or while taking part in any activity organized by, or related to the school. This implies that school rules apply to students even when they are travelling in school transport. No student will be permitted to go out of school during school hours. It must be noted that matters relating to student's discipline reflects in the grades awarded.

Disciplinary issues include the following:

- Absenteeism and late arrival.
- Not following the academic expectations regarding homework, leave assignments, playing truant, and other related issues.
- Improper Dress Code.
- Language: Use of obscene, offensive and demeaning language.
- Being in out of bounds areas.
- Littering in any manner is strictly prohibited.
- Insolence/Disrespect/defiance of authority.
- Not following the transport, IT, Laptop, Mobile and Electronic Gadgets policies.
- Any form of offensive Cyber activity.
- Inappropriate display of affection.
- Credit purchases.
- Bullying.
- Vandalism: Deliberate attempts to disfigure or damage school property.
- Use of chemical substances/ drugs, alcohol, tobacco or intoxicants in any form within and outside the school premises.

DRESS CODE

- 1. All students are expected to respect the dress code / school uniform. All are expected to be dressed smartly and neatly. Students without proper / clean uniform will be sent home or back to the division to change.
- 2. If the clothes do not conform to the specification, parents will be asked to have it remade to specifications as given to the approved outfitters.
- 3. During break or at other times, students are not to play games / football in their classroom.
- 4. During games time or prescribed games, specific uniform is to be used(as informed).
- 5. The use of hair gels, dyes or such material is strictly prohibited. Hair is to be kept trim and combed.
- 6. Students are not permitted to wear ostentatious or expensive jewellery, watches, wristbands or similar accessories.
- 7. Hairstyle must be neat and simple. Punkish and fanciful hairstyles and colouring of hair is not allowed.

- 8. Students are required to be neat and clean in their general appearance.
- 9. The use of cosmetic is not allowed. This includes hair gel, mousse, foundation, eye liner, lip gloss, kajal or any other cosmetic product.
- 10. Jewellery (including ear sticks) is not permitted, except for small, plain ear studs(silver or gold in colour) for girls. There should only be one ear stud for each lobe.
- 11. Fingernails must be kept short and clean Nail paints are strictly not allowed.
- 12. No tattoos or mehndi is allowed.
- 13. Religious articles can be worn only with the written permission of the Class Room Teacher / Principal.
- 14. All students are to wear School shoes. No pointed shoes are allowed. The socks must be properly worn to extent above the ankle. No brand names or labels should be displayed. The wearing of slippers or sandals will be permitted only on medical grounds.



PARENTAL RESPONSIBILITIES

Parents must realize that school is a virtual second home for children. They need all the considerations in their favour by way of safety and security, love and co-curricular work. It is from this point of view that we expect parents and guardians to follow the norms given below.

- 1. Parents are expected to go through the school calendar carefully and make a note of important dates & events, especially Parent-Teacher Meetings, Activities and Assessments. We expect the parents to come regularly & meet the concerned teachers to discuss not only academic progress but also other areas of personality development like attitudes, aptitudes, and confidence building.
- 2. Parents may please see that their child adheres to the school uniform strictly.
- 3. Carrying cell phones, unruly hair and fancy hair clips are not allowed. Skirt hemlines should be knee-length. Oversize, undersize and shabby uniform is not allowed. Low waist trousers are also not allowed.
- 4. Parents/Guardians are not permitted to enter classrooms to meet their children or to seek unscheduled interviews with teachers during school hours.
- 5. In case of emergency, parents/guardians must meet the principal and adopt a course of action in consultation with them.
- 6. NO STRANGERS ARE ALLOWED TO MEET CHILDREN.
- 7. Polybags are not allowed in the school.
- 8. By allowing children to use motorized modes of transportation such as scooters and motor cycles, parents jeopardize their safety besides the illegality involved in permitting an underage child to use these means. Travelling by motorized vehicles to schools is totally BANNED.
- 9. The auto rickshaws with improvised seating for many young children are also an illegal and dangerous mode of transportation and are totally BANNED by the school under instructions from the District Administration. The School does not allow students to bring any motorized vehicle to School.

- 10. Once the child has come to School, parents and guardians are not permitted to take him/her back home during the school hours unless there is a major emergency. In such cases, the permission of the Principal is MANDATORY.
- 11. Parents and guardians must know that NO SCHOOL TEACHER IS ALLOWED TO GIVE PRIVATE TUITION. As such, they should not compel the teachers of this school to accept private tuition work for their wards.
- 12. Parents and guardians must immediately inform the School in case there is a change in their address and/ or telephone number.
- 13. The School organizes excursions/ trips/adventure camps in and around city and also outstation. Parents are requested to ensure that their children participate in all of them as it is another aspect of learning.
- 14. Any communication that parents wish to make with the School (Other than regular communication) must be addressed to the Principal ONLY and not to the class teacher.
- 15. Parents are expected to send only Cadburys/ Fivestar @ Rs.10 (Maximum) for his / her class mate to the School in case of their ward's birthday. Students are welcomed to donate books to the library or Plant sapplings in the school campus. CHILDREN ARE EXPECTED TO COME TO SCHOOL IN DECENT CLOTHES ON THEIR BIRTHDAYS.
- 16. Last but not the least, we expect parents and guardians to be cordial and polite with the staff of the School even in the most undesirable situations.
- 17. No student will be allowed to leave the school early on the plea of attending private coaching classes.
- 18. The parent has to ensure that his/her ward comes on time to the school campus by 8:20 a.m.
- 19. The parents are to send a letter to the Principal for absenteeism for extra sports if the ward wants to go home early if enrolled in extra sports.

ABSENTEEISM AND LATE ARRIVAL POLICY & PRACTICES

- **1.** All students are expected to be punctual for classes and all other activities.
- **2.** If the students arrive to school after 8:30 a.m. the student will be sent back home.
- **3.** No student may absent from the school or from any class except in case of illness.
- **4.** Prior permission is to be sought for absence for any other valid reason apart from illness.
- **5.** Upon return the student must report in with the 'absences and late arrival page' in the handbook duly recording the reason signed by parents/guardian. In case of illness for more than 3 days a 'Medical Certificate' has to be submitted. Leave absence written on loose sheet will not be accepted. Parents are expected to accompany their child if the absence has been long.
- **6.** If attendance is irregular or falls short of the 85% the student will not be permitted to sit for the School Term Examination.

- **7.** Parents have to ensure that their children arrive and leave school punctually. Latecomers to school without a valid reason will face disciplinary action. Those who arrive late will have their names recorded and strict action will be taken against habitual latecomers.
- **8.** Anyone absent from the school for one month or more in succession without intimations or prior permission from the School Authorities will be considered to have left the school.
- **9.** Attendance is compulsory on the first and the last day of the academic year and the day before the school breaks for any vacation.
- **10.** Students are expected to be actively present and participate in all the events organized by the school.

LEAVE RULES FOR STUDENTS

- 1. Children are expected to attend the school regularly. Under affiliation By-Laws of the affiliating boards, all students are expected to log in a minimum attendance of 85% of the total working days in the academic session. As such, no leave of absence is granted unless parents/ guardians submit an application well in advance or on joining station the reason for absence
- 2. In the case of sickness for any period of time , a medical Certificate must be enclosed with the leave application
- 3. If the unauthorized absence exceeds a period of 15 days, the name of the absent student is struck off from the rolls of the school. A re-admission fee of Rs. 5000 shall be charged in case the re-admission is granted.
- 4. Students suffering from infectious diseases such as chicken pox, Cholera, Measles, Mumps, whooping Cough, Swine Flu and jaundice must observe the prescribed period of quarantine, and on returning to school, should produce a doctors certificate permitting him/her to do so.

NORMS RELATING TO EXPULSION/ WITHDRAWAL

Expulsion / Withdrawal of a student from the school is necessitated under certain circumstances either in the student's family or in the School itself. The norms followed in the respect are given below.

Parents must read these norms carefully and comply with them:

- 1. If a student needs to be withdrawn from the school, the parents / guardians of that student must submit a notice in writing one month in advance, failing which the school charges for a month in lieu of the notice period.
- 2. A student can also be expelled by the school on academic on disciplinary grounds including submission of false information to the school at the time of admission or during the year. The Head of the School's decision in such matters is final.
- 3. Misbehavior on the part of parents / guardians with any member of the school staff may also lead to expulsion of the student from the school.
- 4. Transfer Certificate(TC) on withdrawl is issued only after all the school dues are cleared by the parent/ guardian.

Payment of fee:

- 1. All school dues must be paid at school accounts office or head office in a crossed Local Cheque / Demand Draft in favour of Lakshya International School. The cheque / Demand Draft must contain student's name class, Section and residence contact phone number at the back.
- 2. Fee should be paid by the 'last date of payment' as indicated above.
- 3. If 'the last date of payment' is a holiday then day before such holiday is considered to be "the last date of payment".
- 4. Fine for late payment of fee: if fee is not paid by the" last date of payment" a fine of 1% for the first month and then 2% for the second month will be charged from the "Last date of payment" and till the day of payment fee.
- 5. Issuing of fee reminders is not mandatory for the school. It is the duty of parents to deposit the fee as per the above schedule.
- 6. All communications regarding fee are normally routed through software and the students. Parents are requested to make their wards aware in this regard.
- 7. All the dues are to be cleared on term basis
- 8. All correspondence / queries with respect to the school dues should be taken up directly with the School Accounts Department.
- 9. To facilitate the parents the school will accept post dated cheques for term fee in school A/c deptt. Acceptance of such cheques will be subject to last date of payment by cheque. No request will be accepted to hold the cheques after the date mentioned on the cheque.

IMPORTANT NOTE REGARDING SCHOOL FEE

10. Cheque returned by the bank on which it is drawn, for any reason whatsoever shall be treated as non payment of dues and an additional amount of Rs.450/shall be charged towards expenses along with the late fine & additional penalty as the case may be till final clearance of the fee.

- 11. No fee shall be treated as the current term fee or advance fee until and unless all previous fee dues are cleared in full.
- 12. Discontinuation of bus facility is not permissible in the middle of an academic session. Request for discontinuation for the next session must be submitted to the school Accounts Office by the 15th March, in case of transfer / change of address, after submitting an application to the Accounts office 15 days in advance
- 13. Fee shall be payable for the whole term if the student attends the school even for one day during the term

TRANSPORT RULES

- 1. The school makes transport arrangements for the children by hiring buses on an annual contract explicitly on request from parents.
- 2. Unauthorized in the hired buses is viewed as a serious offence and can lead to a fine of Rs. 500/-.
- 3. Parents are expected to co-operate with the school by ensuring that their embarking points well on time, carry their user Identity with them all the time and behave in a disciplined way in the interest of their own safety as well as the other users.
- 4. International vandalism such as breaking windowpanes, tearing and cutting of seat covers, defacing the interior of the bus and any other related offence will result in heavy damage penalty and expulsion from the facility.
- 5. Students must ensure that they do not get into unacceptability behaviour in the school bus. Bullying, use of abusive language and misbehavior during travelling will lead to expulsion from the facility.
- 6. Parents are requested to study the specified routes and those which suit them the best. Please remember that it is not possible to cater to individual requirements at the cost of time and distance.
- 7. In case you have genuine grievance, please submit it in writing to the Teacher escorting the bus or to the Transport Incharge.
- 8. The use of bus facility cannot be discontinued in the middle of the session.

HOUSE SYSTEM
